More than 28,000 people in Canada live with young onset dementia (YOD). **'Young onset' means someone is under 65 when they develop dementia.** YOD affects people aged 18 to 64.

YOD is a diverse condition. An individual's experience of living with YOD will be influenced by many factors including their family system, job or income, gender and ethnocultural community.
